


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"WHEN I AM AFRAID, I WILL PUT MY TRUST IN YOU"

Psalm 56:3

The Christian Courage

Fear is, beyond the whole suite of psychoanalytic theories, one of the consequences of the fall into sin. One of the first feelings that tempted Adam immediately after the fall was not envy, not greed, not anger, but fear: "He said, "I heard the sound of You in the garden, and **I was afraid** because I was naked; so I hid myself" (Genesis 3:10). Fear is the direct consequence of man's alienation from the One whose presence was supposed to be his Shield,

the reminiscences of sin in the heart of man, even in His children. Therefore, every "fear not" spoken by God on the pages of Scripture should not be understood as "feel no sense of fear" but rather as "overcome, through faith in Me, every sense of fear." Courage is not the absence of fear but the overcoming of it by faith, and faith in God does not cancel fear but gives the power to overcome it. So many times, throughout Scripture, God tells believers not to be overcome by fear: "Be strong and courageous! Do not be terrified nor dismayed" (Joshua 1:9); "take courage and be courageous!" (Daniel 10:19); "Do not fear them, for the Lord your God is the One fighting for you." (Deuteronomy 3:22); "When I am afraid, I will put my trust in You" (Psalm 56:3).

By falling into sin, man was separated from his Protector. God drew near to man through redemption in Christ's death and resurrection. Therefore, every commandment to not be afraid has its basis in the assurance that the One from whom we were once strangers is now our Shield, Protection, and Shelter, and fear no longer finds its reason. The New Testament is also a eulogy of courage and boldness through faith in Christ, of great deeds for His cause: "And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but are unable to kill the soul; but rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell." (Matthew 10:28); "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid." (Matthew 14:27); "Peace I leave you, My peace I give you; not as the world gives, do I give to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled, nor fearful." (John 14:27)

As of old, the Christian today is commanded, "Fear not!" Times are hard, the economic crisis is pressing, and worries are multiplying, but our Protector is present beside us every day. The future does not look rosy for believers - we do not know how long we will have the freedom to serve God, and we do not know what the times and circumstances will look like. Queen Elizabeth II said in a televised Christmas message in 1957: "Today we need a special kind of courage, not the kind needed in battle but a kind which makes us stand up for everything that we know is right, everything that is true and honest." We need the courage that overcomes fear through faith in God to stand up for the truth of Christ, to stay with Him when most leave Him, and to influence future generations for good, to lead them to Him. Courage!
