A perspective that allows us to look at and along things influences our beliefs and behavior. Looking at the future through the lens of hardships on earth, you will be worried and discouraged because you will feel that the problems are overwhelming and God is far away and cannot deliver you. On the other hand, if you look at the circumstances on earth from a heavenly perspective, then you find that the God who rules history is all-powerful, all-knowing, all-present, and full of love and goodness. The troubles and hardships are infinitely smaller than Him. Such a perspective results in great faith, mobilizing courage, and holy joy in the journey. Psalm 84 captures this truth:

Blessed is the person whose strength is in You, In whose heart are the roads to Zion!

Passing through the Valley of Baca they make it a spring; The early rain also covers it with blessings.

They go from strength to strength,

Every one of them appears before God in Zion. (v. 5-7)

An emphasis on the faithful people who view history from heaven's perspective does not deny or neglect their earthly realities and responsibilities. On the contrary, as Psalm 1 describes, when you have a correct perspective on reality, you know what the things to be avoided are – to which you say NO, and what the things to be done are – to which you say YES. Armed with a perspective from above and clear biblical priorities, these people finish well what they started - they reach their destination.

With this perspective, we embark on a new year of study at Emmanuel University that centers on discipleship and service in the preparation program for the works of the Kingdom of God.
