

1. They are "set aside" young people

Some of the main meanings of the word "holy" are "different" or "set aside." We thank God that he gives us a new generation of young people eager to live differently than culture and be holy every year. Their mindset, speech, and lives testify that they love Jesus Christ. Of such young people, Scripture tells us, "And those who have insight will shine like the glow of the expanse of heaven, and those who lead the many to righteousness, like the stars forever and ever."
